



► CLINICAL NOTES

* This formula is specific for blood stasis in the lower abdomen due to deficiency cold that disrupts the fluid dynamics. This generates dryness and causes heat from deficiency to flush upward. Manifestations of blood deficiency and internal cold include a pale complexion, aversion to cold, cold lower extremities, loose stools, frequent urination, and a tongue that is pale, thin, and feeble pulse. The deficiency cold in this pattern will be accompanied by signs of heat or dryness such as dry and cracked lips or mucous membranes, dry mouth, hot hands and feet, hot flushes, or feverish sensations. Finally, while there are signs of stasis in this pattern, such as abdominal fullness, pain, or muscle tension, the abdomen generally remains soft.

1. As the primary function here is to restrain, tonify, or soften, Paeoniae Radix (*sháo yào*) is preferred.

On the right page is a full display of the composition of the formula. Each of the ingredients is color coded to show its taste and temperature, and the overall nature of the formula—warming, cooling, neutral etc.—can be seen at a glance. The role that each ingredient plays in the formula (chief, deputy, assistant, envoy), as well as its actions, are also shown.

An introduction discusses how different types of processing affect the functions of particular herbs. There is also a helpful discussion of the Japanese approach to abdominal diagnosis and its value in prescribing herbs. The book includes both a formula index (by pinyin and English common name) and an index of patterns and key symptoms.

Each formula is presented as a two-page spread. On the left is a drawing of a person reflecting an issue that is typical of a type of patient for whom the formula might be prescribed. The drawing is labeled with key symptoms for quick reference. Beneath the drawing are the ingredients followed by other basic information: actions, main pattern, key and secondary symptoms, tongue, pulse, and abdomen. This can be absorbed in just a few moments.

Additional detail is set forth in clinical notes, and other formulas with similar indications are discussed for purposes of comparison.
